About 2 years ago Tinah (Christine) contacted Halina via social media (LinkedIn) with reference to The Host Apostolate... She was looking for help with her projects and specifically enabling young women to find work with little schooling or training. In the first instance her request was for hairdryers – we negotiated over this one as it was not central to our apostolate. Our first reaction was that

this was a one-off support... hairdryers were sent.



We sent two parcels.

This initial contact cemented ongoing support as we were very impressed with what she had achieved, and she sent us photos of successful ‘students’ who now could work as hairdressers.

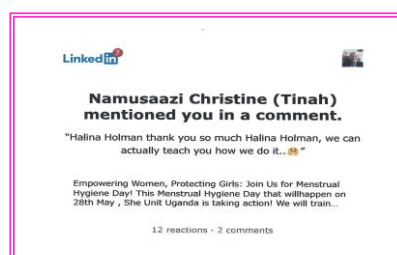

As personal hygiene is an issue with lack of basic supplies, she organised a ‘Menstrual Hygiene Day Event’ with an aim to end ‘Period Poverty’. Many young girls cannot attend school during ‘period’ time. As we already send hygiene product to a few projects we decided to contribute.



She also asked us to sell some purses that had been made to raise funds. There has also been a need to support Tinah with donations which we will continue to do as best we can.
