English is spoken as well as Swahili and Arabic languages. About a third of the population is Christian, a third is Muslim and a third practise other local religions.

We will keep you updated as we hear more.

We continue to send Fr. Aloyce and his students both catechetical and school literature. Parcels seem to get through... We have also sent liturgical goods such as chalice and paten as well as altar materials. Stoles were very well received. WE continue to have a good relationship with Fr. Aloyce whom we keep in prayer.
